

The increased cost for one compensable day in FY 2020 compared to FY 2019 is calculated by dividing the FY 2018 estimated personnel compensation \$602,514 and applicable benefits \$182,574 by 261 compensable days is \$3,008.

The \$303 request reflects anticipated changes in payments to the Department of Labor for injury benefits under the Federal Employee Compensation Act.			
3 FERS Rate Increase	0	0	15,771
Per 2018 OMB Circular A-11 section 32, Personnel Compensation, Benefits, and Related Costs, the agency contribution of regular retirement under FERS will increase from 13.7% to 16%. The FERS contribution for Law Enforcement retirement will increase from 30.1% to 33.4%. The amount requested, \$15,771, represents the funds needed to cover this increase.

Effective January 2020, the component's contribution to Federal employees' health insurance increases by 2.3 percent. Applied against the 2019 estimate of \$48,130, the additional amount required is \$1,107.			
5 Retirement	0	0	1,133
Agency retirement contributions increase as employees under CSRS retire and are replaced by FERS employees. Based on U.S. Department of Justice Agency estimates, we project that the DOJ workforce will convert from CSRS to FERS at a rate of 0.8 percent per year, for both LEO and Non-LEO, based on the past 5 years of DOJ retirement data. The requested increase of \$1,133 is necessary to meet our increased retirement obligations as a result of this conversion.

GSA will continue to charge rental rates that approximate those charged to commercial tenants for equivalent space and related services. The requested increase of \$3,623 is required to meet our commitment to GSA. The costs associated with GSA rent were derived through the use of an automated system, which uses the latest inventory data, including rate increases to be effective FY 2020 for each building currently occupied by Department of Justice components, as well as the costs of new space to be occupied. GSA provides data on the rate increase.

This includes Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Federal Protective Service charges, Justice Protective Service charges and other security services across the country. The requested increase of \$2,613 is required to meet these commitments.

GSA requires all agencies to pay relocation costs associated with lease expirations. This request provides for the costs associated with new office relocations caused by the expiration of leases in FY 2020.

Foreign Expenses 1 Capital Security Cost Sharing Per P.L. 108-447 and subsequent acts, "all agencies with personnel overseas subject to chief of mission authorityshall participate and provide funding in advance for their share of costs of providing new, safe, secure U.S. diplomatic facilities, without offsets, on the basis of the total overseas presence of each agency as determined by the Secretary of State." Originally authorized for FY 2000-2004, the program has been extended annually by OMB and Congress and has also been expanded beyond new embassy construction to include maintenance and renovation costs of the new facilities. For the purpose of this program, State's personnel totals for DOJ include current and projected staffing. The estimated cost to the Department, as provided by State, for FY 2020 is \$119,264,768. Status of Congressionally Requested Studies, Reports, and Evaluations

Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives

- 1. The Senate Report associated with the FY 2018 appropriations act directs ATF to submit an annual report on U.S. and Mexico firearms trafficking and trace data.
- 2. The Senate Report associated with the FY 2019 appropriations act Section 505 directs ATF to notify the Committee by letter, at least 15 days prior to reprogramming of funds in excess of \$500,000 or 10 percent whichever is less, also applicable in cases where funding for an activity is reduced by 10 percent. Reprogramming or transfer requests shall be submitted only in the case of an unforeseen emergency or situation that could not have been anticipated when formulating the budget request for the current fiscal year
- 3. The Senate Report associated with the FY 2019 appropriations act Section 533 directs ATF to submit spending plans to the House and Senate Appropriations Committees within 45 days of enactment of this act.
- 4. The House Report associated with the FY 2019 appropriations act directs ATF to evaluate available alternatives to the current American Table of Distances (ATD) standards on Explosives storage and report to the Committee not later than six months after enactment on the potential costs and benefits, to include implementation.
- 5. The House Report associated with the FY 2019 appropriations act directs DOJ to update the Committee on its NIBIN effort not later than 90 days after enactment.
