Andrea R. Carroll-Tipton, Administrative Law Judge

Attorney General William P. Barr appointed Andrea R. Carroll-Tipton as an Administrative Law Judge in November 2020. Judge Carroll-Tipton earned a Bachelor of Arts in 2005 from the University of Illinois, a Juris Doctor in 2008 from DePaul University College of Law, and a Master of Laws in 2015 from George Washington University College of Law. From 2019 to 2020, she served as an attorney in the Pacific District, Office of General Counsel, Department of Veterans Affairs. From 2008 to 2019, she served as a judge advocate with the U.S. Air Force in the following locations: Tinker Air Force Base, Oklahoma; Joint Base Andrews, Maryland; Los Angeles Air Force Base, California; and MacDill Air Force Base, Florida. Judge Carroll-Tipton is a member of the Illinois State Bar.

John A. Henderson Jr., Administrative Law Judge

Attorney General William P. Barr appointed John A. Henderson Jr. as an Administrative Law Judge in November 2020. Judge Henderson earned a Bachelor of Arts in 2000 from the University of Maryland, College Park; a Juris Doctor in 2006 from the Catholic University of America, Columbus School of Law; and a Master of Laws in 2014 from the Georgetown University Law Center.
