Who provides T & TA?

The current TYP training and technical assistance provider is Fox Valley Technical College, Criminal Justice Center for Innovation.

Who is Eligible for T & TA?

Training and technical assistance is available to Native American Indian tribes, as defined in 25 U.S.C. 450 (b)e; Alaska Native communities; and OJJDP TYP grantees.

What is the cost?

T & TA is FREE to Tribal Youth Programs and any Federally Recognized Tribe and Alaska Native Community

Key Points

- Requests for **on-site** T&TA must go through our process and must be approved by your Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention program manager and the Tribal Youth Programs Coordinator
- If the request is from a Tribal Youth Program, the T & TA request must address the goal(s) of your Tribal Youth Program

How FVTC Addressed the TA request:

The on-site TA request was processed and one FVTC staff traveled to the tribe's reservation. Over the course of two days FVTC staff worked with the Tribe's team.

- Staff observed a team meeting and provided feedback.
- Facilitated team building activities with the TYP team and the AODA team members.

Example of a multi-tribe TA

How FVTC Addressed the TA request:

The Training request was processed and two FVTC staff traveled to a central location to facilitate the training. Over the course of three days FVTC staff worked with the three teams in the planning process.

- The teams participated in activities and planning for thier Tribal Youth Program.
- The teams left with their planning workbooks and a 30-60-90 day plan.

T & TA Request Process

- TA request is submitted
- An acknowledgment letter is received by the requester from FVTC w/in 2 working days
- Consultant (s) matched and contact is made with the requesting program w/in first week of approval
- OJDP decision of approval is made w/in 5 working days

T & TA Request Process

- Consultant (s) on-site w/in 21 working days of OJJDP approval
- Site-visit report from consultant (s) w/in 10 working days
- OJJDP approves report w/in 14 working days
- Tribe receives report w/in 7 working days of OJJDP approval
