If you were convicted during the Vietnam War era of a draft violation and were pardoned by the presidential pardon proclamation of January 21, 1977, you may obtain an individual certificate of pardon showing that the proclamation applies to you if you can produce the necessary documentation from your prosecution. If you believe that the proclamation applies to you and wish to obtain such a certificate, complete this application and return it with the required documents to USPardon. The documents you must provide are: (1) the charging document (the indictment or criminal information) and (2) the judgment of conviction or the court docket sheet showing the sentence and date it was imposed.
