This letter presents the views of the Department of Justice (Department) on S. 2151, the "Strong Communities Act," as passed in the Senate on August 1, 2022. The Department supports this bill.

Since 1994, the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS Office) has invested more than \$14 billion to help advance community policing. The Strong Communities Act amends the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to provide grants from the COPS Office that may be used for local law enforcement recruits to attend schools or academies if the recruits agree to serve in precincts of law enforcement agencies in their communities.

Community policing begins with a commitment to building trust and mutual respect between police and communities. It is critical to public safety, ensuring that all stakeholders work together to address our nation's crime challenges. When police and communities collaborate, they more effectively address underlying issues by changing negative behavioral patterns.
