VOLUNTEER/WORK-STUDY LEGAL INTERN POSITIONS**

Created in 1987, the Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section (CEOS) prosecutes those who possess, manufacture, or distribute child pornography; those who sell, buy, or transport women and children interstate or internationally to engage in sexually explicit conduct; those who travel interstate or internationally to sexually abuse children; those who abuse children on federal and Indian lands; those who do not pay certain court ordered child support payments; those who transport obscene materials in interstate or foreign commerce; and international parental abduction. CEOS attorneys assist the 94 United States Attorneys' Offices (USAOs) in investigations, trials, and appeals related to these offenses.

**POSITION LOCATION(S):** Washington, D.C.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Second- and third-year law students are eligible to apply. Prior to finalizing an appointment as a volunteer/work-study legal intern, all interns are required to undergo a security check, which includes a name and fingerprint clearance by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and a determination of suitability for employment based on the information a candidate provides in the security form.

**DATE POSITION(S) AVAILABLE:** Fall Semester (September – December)  
Spring Semester (January – May)  
Summer (June – August)

**ASSIGNMENTS:** Legal interns work directly with the Section's trial attorneys on a variety of assignments, ranging from conducting legal research and writing to assisting in investigations and prosecutions of child exploitation and obscenity offenses.
