INFORMATION

COUNT ONE

THE UNITED STATES ATTORNEY CHARGES THAT:

On or about July 10, 2003, at Upper Darby, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, the defendant,

HUMAIYA JAWED,

in a matter within the jurisdiction of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, an agency of the executive branch of the government of the United States, knowingly and willfully made materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statements and representations, in that defendant HUMAIYA JAWED said that a person known to the Grand Jury ["the person"] who was wanted on an administrative arrest warrant, was now in a specified foreign country and had been in that country for the last two years, when as the defendant HUMAIYA JAWED knew, the person: had resided with her in Upper Darby, Pennsylvania within the past two years; kept his clothes and received mail at the Upper Darby address; and was still in the United States.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1001(a)(2).

COUNT TWO

THE UNITED STATES ATTORNEY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

On or about July 10, 2003, at Upper Darby, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, the defendant,

HUMAIYA JAWED,

in a matter within the jurisdiction of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, an agency of the executive branch of the government of the United States, knowingly and willfully made materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statements and representations, in that, defendant HUMAIYA JAWED said that she, a person who had entered the United States on a student visa, was enrolled for classes at Philadelphia Community College, when as defendant HUMAIYA JAWED knew, she had not enrolled in or attended classes at Philadelphia Community College.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1001(a)(2).
