**INFORMATION**

**COUNT ONE**  
**(Conspiracy to Distribute Cocaine)**

**THE UNITED STATES ATTORNEY CHARGES THAT:**

1. From in or about November 2000, through in or about November 2001, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania and elsewhere defendant

**ROBERT DINTINO**

and co-conspirator Michael Focoso conspired and agreed together, and with others known and unknown to the United States Attorney, to knowingly and intentionally distribute a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of cocaine, a Schedule II controlled substance, in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841(a)(1) and 841(b)(1)(C).

**MANNER AND MEANS**

2. It was part of the conspiracy that at various times during the period of the conspiracy Michael Focoso acquired cocaine from others known to the United States Attorney and sold the cocaine to **ROBERT DINTINO** for redistribution.

3. It was further part of the conspiracy that **ROBERT DINTINO** sold the cocaine he received from Michael Focoso and used part of the proceeds he received from the redistribution of the cocaine to pay Michael Focoso for the cocaine.

**OVERT ACTS**

4. In or about November 2001 **ROBERT DINTINO** received approximately twenty-eight (28) grams of cocaine from Michael Focoso for distribution.

All in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Section 846.

**COUNT TWO**  
**(Distribution)**

**THE UNITED STATES ATTORNEY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:**

On or about July 12, 2001, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania and elsewhere,  
defendant

**ROBERT DINTINO**

knowingly and intentionally distributed one hundred and twenty-nine point three (129.3) grams of  
a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of cocaine, a Schedule II controlled  
substance, to an undercover police officer.

In violation of Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841(a)(1) and 841(b)(1)(C).
