



the Middletown Township Police Department that his 2001 Ford Focus (VIN 1FAFP33PX1W303906) had been stolen on or about September 6, 2001.

5. On or about October 28, 2001, defendant JOSHUA REYNOZO falsely reported by filing an affidavit of theft to his insurance company, Allstate Insurance Company, that his 2001 Ford Focus (VIN 1FAFP33PX1W303906) had been stolen.

6. Defendant JOSHUA REYNOZO made these false reports to the police and Allstate Insurance Company knowing that this would result in Allstate Insurance Company paying off the loan for the vehicle.

7. Defendant JOSHUA REYNOZO intended to cause a loss of approximately \$14,335.00 to Allstate Insurance Company as a result of his mail fraud scheme.

8. On or about December 20, 2001, Allstate Insurance Company denied the claim based on defendant JOSHUA REYNOZO's material misrepresentations and inconsistent versions of facts.

9. Although Allstate Insurance denied defendant JOSHUA REYNOZO's claim, Allstate Insurance incurred costs in investigating the claim and in providing defendant JOSHUA REYNOZO with a rented car in an amount totaling \$2,783.61; an amount paid through the U.S. Mail.

10. On or about October 15, 2001, at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania and elsewhere, having devised and intending to devise the scheme, defendant

for the purpose of executing the scheme described above and attempting to do so, knowingly

caused to be delivered by mail, a check in the amount of \$40.00, mailed from Allstate Insurance Company, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, to Enterprise Rent-A-Car, in Langhorne, Pennsylvania; an amount paid out for car rental.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1341.
