FEDERAL PROSECUTOR TO ASSIST WITH FOREIGN INTELLIGENCE REVIEWS

(Plano, Texas) U.S. Attorney Matthew D. Orwig announced today that First Assistant United States Attorney, **BECKY GREGORY** will be departing for a five month special assignment in Washington, D.C. as a Special Assistant working with the Office of Intelligence Policy and Review (OIPR).

OIPR is the component of the Department of Justice which conducts intelligence investigations of foreign powers and agents of foreign powers engaged in terrorism, espionage, and sabotage occurring in the United States. OIPR also implements the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act (FISA), which was passed by Congress in 1978. OIPR works with agents in the Federal Bureau of Investigation's field offices throughout the United States and in Washington, D.C. to process FISA applications.

U.S. Attorney Matt Orwig says Gregory's special assignment to OIPR is a true testament to her commitment to justice, "Becky Gregory brings considerable talents to this important assignment. Mrs. Gregory's brilliant legal mind and unwavering focus will serve her, and our Nation, well."
