FRISCO MAN SENTENCED FOR PASSPORT FRAUD

(Sherman) A 38-year-old Frisco man was sentenced to (1) one year probation and a \$2,000 fine for making a false statement on an application for a United States passport. **CHRISTOPHER LEE MADDEN** was sentenced today by United States District Judge Richard Schell.

According to documents presented by prosecutors, Madden admitted that on May 4, 2001, he made the passport application at the United States Consulate in Milan, Italy. Madden stated in the passport application that his name was Phillip Spencer Madden. Madden admitted that he knew the statement was false and that his intent was to obtain a U.S. passport for himself in the name of Phillip Spencer Madden.

The case was investigated by the U.S. Department of State's Diplomatic Security Service. The case was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney, Andy Williams.
