### Social Media Storm: Tuesday, November 14, 2023, 11am -12pm

Community and organizational partners are encouraged to participate in our United Against Hate Week social media Storm.

A social media storm is a spike in social media activity surrounding a topic. This is accomplished by having specific social media post shared and re-shared during a short, specified time period.

Step 1: Social Media Post: [Insert what a hate-free San Diego looks like to you] or post one of the UAHW images from the website #SDUnitedAgainstHateWeek, and #UnitedAgainstHateWeek

**Example:** "A hate-free San Diego is where I no longer feel judged based on my skin color and who I choose to love. #SDUnitedAgainstHateWeek and #UnitedAgainstHateWeek"

**Step 2**: Repost and like social media post visible through your timeline and that can be found through the #SDUnitedAgainstHateWeek and #UnitedAgainstHateWeek tag.

**Step 3:** If you want elected officials, partners of civil leaders to copy your social media post, please tag them! During the social media storm, you can send multiple social media post and also comment on others' post.

**Step 4:** Have fun!

**Instructions:** Open the social media app of your choice and record your message.

- State: "I stand against hate because \_\_\_\_\_\_, join me and share why you stand against hate #SDUnitedAgainstHateWeek and #UnitedAgainstHateWeek"
- Post and share with your followers

### Stand up against hate with our United Against Hate Week Pledge Card.


Download our pledge card and write out what a hate-free San Diego looks like to you.
