INFORMATION

The United States Attorney charges that:

GENERAL ALLEGATIONS

At all times relevant to this Information:

1. The defendant, **IOANNIS C. KRALIEVITS**, was a resident of Miami-Dade County, Florida. **KRALIEVITS** was the co-owner of Business A, a restaurant, and sole owner of Business B, a catering and food service business. Businesses A and B were located in Miami, Florida.

2. Co-conspirator A was a resident of Miami-Dade County, Florida, and an associate

of IOANNIS C. KRALIEVITS.

3. Bank A was a participating lender of funds to small businesses under the Paycheck Protection Program ("PPP") in 2020. Under the PPP, the Small Business Administration agreed to guarantee loans provided by participant lenders under certain conditions. Financial Service Provider A connected PPP loan applicants to qualified lenders. 4. In order to obtain a PPP loan, an applicant had to submit an application listing the number of employees and average monthly payroll expenses for the applicant's company. Furthermore, the applicant had to certify that the funds would be used for payroll and other authorized expenses for the applicant's company.

Conspiracy to Commit Wire Fraud (18 U.S.C. § 371)

From on or about May 19, 2020, through on or about July 6, 2020, in Miami-Dade County, in the Southern District of Florida, and elsewhere, the defendant,

IOANNIS C. KRALIEVITS,

did knowingly and willfully combine, conspire, confederate, and agree with other individuals known and unknown to the United States Attorney, to commit certain offenses against the United States, namely: to knowingly, and with the intent to defraud, devise, and intend to devise, a scheme and artifice to defraud, and to obtain money and property by means of materially false and fraudulent pretenses, representations, and promises, knowing that the pretenses, representations, and promises were false and fraudulent when made, and for the purpose of executing such scheme and artifice, did knowingly transmit and cause to be transmitted, by means of wire communication in interstate commerce, certain writings, signs, signals, pictures, and sounds, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1343.

PURPOSE OF THE CONSPIRACY

It was the purpose of the conspiracy for the defendant and his co-conspirators to unjustly enrich themselves by submitting and causing others to submit to financial institutions false and fraudulent PPP loan applications that falsely certified employee payroll amounts and falsely certified that the funds would be used for payroll and other authorized expenses.

MANNER AND MEANS OF THE CONSPIRACY

The manner and means by which the defendant and his conspirators sought to accomplish the object and purpose of the conspiracy included, among others, the following:

5. **IOANNIS C. KRALIEVITS** provided his personal identifiers to Co-conspirator A with the understanding that Co-conspirator A would apply for a PPP loan for Business B in exchange for a portion of any PPP proceeds. **KRALIEVITS** also provided Co-conspirator A with access to the Business B bank account at Bank B for the purpose of depositing PPP proceeds that Co-conspirator A obtained on behalf of **KRALIEVITS** and Business B.

6. **IOANNIS C. KRALIEVITS** knew that Co-conspirator A was not an employee of Business B and was not otherwise entitled to be paid a finder's fee from PPP proceeds.

7. On or about July 6, 2020, Co-conspirator A made a number of false statements on the electronically submitted loan application for Business B, including: (a) claiming an "average monthly payroll" of \$306,800; (b) listing 42 employees; and (c) certifying that "The funds will be used to retain workers and maintain payroll or make mortgage interest payments, lease payments, and utility payments as specified under the Paycheck Protection Program Rule." At no time did Business B have an average monthly payroll of as much as \$306,800 or as many as 42 employees.

8. **IOANNIS C. KRALIEVITS** did not provide specific average monthly payroll or number of employees to Co-conspirator A but understood that Co-conspirator A would apply for an amount greater than the amount that Business B needed to retain workers, maintain payroll, or make mortgage interest, lease or utility payments.

9. Co-conspirator A submitted false and fraudulent Internal Revenue Service forms as support for those payroll expenses.

10. Business B received approximately \$767,000 from Bank A through the PPP loan application that Co-conspirator A electronically submitted, via interstate wire, on behalf of **IOANNIS C. KRALIEVITS** based on the false and fraudulent loan application.

11. **IOANNIS C. KRALIEVITS** used the funds received from the PPP loan applications for unauthorized purposes such as to pay taxes and repay loans, the true nature of which **KRALIEVITS** concealed as payroll.

12. In addition to the loan for Business B, **IOANNIS C. KRALIEVITS** knew that Coconspirator A was assisting **KRALIEVITS**'s co-owner of Business A, to obtain a PPP loan for Business A. **KRALIEVITS** understood that the loan application submitted for Business A on or about July 8, 2020, was for an amount greater than the amount that Business A needed to retain workers, maintain payroll, or make mortgage interest, lease or utility payments. Bank A funded that loan to Business A in the amount of approximately \$57,750.

OVERT ACT

In furtherance of the conspiracy and to achieve its objects and purpose, at least one of the co-conspirators committed and caused to be committed, in the Southern District of Florida, and elsewhere, at least one of the following overt acts, among others:

1. On or about July 6, 2020, Co-conspirator A submitted a Small Business Administration Borrower Application Form electronically to Bank A, which Co-conspirator A had signed for **IOANNIS C. KRALIEVITS**, falsely certifying the average monthly payroll for Business B as \$306,800.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 371.

<u>FORFEITURE</u> (18 U.S.C. § 982(a)(2)(A))

1. The allegations of this Information are hereby re-alleged and by this reference fully incorporated herein for the purpose of alleging forfeiture to the United States of America of certain property in which the defendant, **IOANNIS C. KRALIEVITS**, has an interest.

2. Upon conviction of a violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 371, as alleged in this Information, the defendant shall forfeit to the United States any property constituting, or derived from, proceeds the defendant obtained directly or indirectly, as the result of such violation pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 982(a)(2)(A).

3. The property subject to forfeiture includes, but is not limited to, the following: a forfeiture money judgment in the amount of \$824,750.00, which sum represents the amount of directly forfeitable property.
